Proclamation

Whereas, for over half a century – beginning with the National School Lunch Program in 1946 – the nation has steadily built an array of nutrition assistance programs to build a healthier generation of Americans; and

Whereas, during the school year, more than 1.8 million New York students receive meals through the National School Breakfast and Lunch Programs; and

Whereas, when schools let out, many of these children will lose access to these healthy meals; and

Whereas, children need good nutrition all year long, and since 1975, the Summer Food Service Program has alleviated this burden by nourishing children and teens while school is out; and

Whereas, summer meals are free, nutritious meals and snacks that are provided to kids and teens, 18 years of age and younger, throughout the summer; and

Whereas, currently only 28% of children who eat free or reduced school lunch are participating in the summer meals program in New York; and

Whereas, this summer, children in New York can participate in the summer meals program at approximately 2,600 sites across the state; and

Whereas, the New York State Department of Health's Growing Up Healthy Hotline, 1-800-522-5006, can help New Yorkers locate summer meal sites in their community; and


Whereas, we want to ensure that every child in the state of New York has access to nutritious meals during the summer;
