Honoring members of the New York National Guard for their service during and in the aftermath of the September 11, 2001 attacks

Whereas, two decades have passed since the unimaginable events of September 11, 2001 that forever changed our state and nation; and

Whereas, New Yorkers owe a debt of deep gratitude to those first responders and members of the armed forces who risked their lives in the weeks, months, and years following the attacks on the World Trade Center; and

Whereas, on September 11th, New York Air National Guardsmen assigned to the Northeast Air Defense Sector were the first U.S. military members to respond to the hijacking of civilian airliners used in the attacks, and responded to scramble aircraft to intercept the planes; and

Thereas, on September 11th, members of the New York Army National Guard responded to the attack by rallying at their armories in anticipation of the Governor's orders to duty; and

Whereas, on September 11th, members of the New York Army National Guard's 1st Battalion, 69th Infantry, 1st Battalion, 101st Cavalry, 1st Battalion, 258th Field Artillery, 1st Battalion, 105th Infantry, the 107th Corps Support Group and the 2nd Civil Support Team, responded to support to the New York City Police Department and the New York City Fire Department; and

Phereas, from September 12th - November 17th, a total of 6,716 members of the New York Army and Air National Guard, New York Naval Militia, and New York Guard, provided security and logistics support to recovery workers and the people of New York City as part of Operation Trade Center; and

##hereas, members of the New York Army National Guard's 27th Infantry Brigade; 42nd Infantry Division; and the New York Air National Guard's 174th Fighter Wing provided security at 19 airports throughout the State, the United States Military Academy and the Watervliet Arsenal, and conducted Combat Air Patrols as part of Operation Noble Eagle; and

Whereas, 450 New York Army National Guard Soldiers assigned to Joint Task Force Wingfoot assisted in New York City security from November 17, 2001 to January 31, 2002; and

##hereas, most of the Soldiers and Airmen who were part of these missions deployed in support of the Global War on Terrorism, and served in combat in Iraq and Afghanistan to protect the interests of the United States; and

Thereas, these brave men and women of New York National Guard, who served and sacrificed on those days following this attack on our American soil, deserve continued recognition through the past twenty years;
