

Proclamation

Exercis, throughout America's history our armed forces have selflessly stepped forth to defend our country, and we join to pay tribute to all New Yorkers currently serving in our nation's military; and

Whereas, our state recognizes that the people who serve in the armed forces make tremendous sacrifices and that their families do as well, especially the children who endure months and even years of separation from a parent serving tours of duty; and

Exercise, these children are heroes themselves, spending birthdays, holidays, weekends, bedtime readings, school functions, and other daily routines without one parent, or sometimes even both parents, and profoundly missing that significant presence as a regular part of their lives; and

Experses, older military children likewise feel the effects of a parent on active duty, enduring frequent moves and deployment-related transitions that can be difficult and stressful; these teenage children face the challenge of making new friends and adjusting to life on new military bases and in new schools, while often experiencing anxieties and concerns over their parent's safety; and

Experses, New York State is a member of the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, ensuring in law and in practice that the frequent moves inherent to military service never pose a barrier to the educational success of any of the military children attending schools within this great State; and

##hereas, each April, Americans pause to recognize our nation's military children during the Month of the Military Child

– a nationwide observance that highlights the important and special place children have in the armed forces community; and

hereas, the lives of military families are challenging, and New Yorkers take this opportunity to thank those military families who make daily sacrifices in support of their family members' service to America, and we especially remember the children of our military families, and join to express our support for them;
