

- **Down 15% Outside NYC**


Shootings, 2017-2022


OUTSIDE NEW YORK CITY, SHOOTINGS ARE BELOW PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS






IN NEW YORK CITY, SHOOTINGS ARE CLOSE TO PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS






MURDERS DOWN 11% IN 2022 VS. 2021

Murders, New York State




For the largest 14 states, New York has a homicide rate almost 2x lower than the national average

Homicides per 100,000, 12 months ending with Q2 of 2022




INDEX CRIME UP 21% 2022 vs. 2021

\$337 MILLION TO REDUCE & PREVENT GUN VIOLENCE

Investments include:


- \$64.1 million for youth employment programs
- **570 million** to help communities respond to gun violence
- \$52 million for aid to prosecutors
- \$36 million for the Gun Involved Violence Elimination Initiative (GIVE)
- \$31.1 million for crime reduction, youth justice, and gang prevention programs
- \$25 million for the SNUG Street Outreach program
- \$12.8 million to expand State Police Community Stabilization Units
