 - Commission Chair reviewed and facilitated discussion around the key findings to date for LTSS and Hospitals, which she emphasized should underpin recommendations put forth by the Commission
- **Discussion on cross-committee topic: Workforce**
 - Commission reviewed analyses on NYS' health care workforce including actions the State has taken to date to bolster the workforce

 - Hospital Subcommittee convened to review learnings from other states and indications of success (or lack of) on partnerships, payment models, and Certificate of Need
