Whereas, firefighting requires both aptitude and bravery, making it one of the most physically, mentally, and emotionally challenging jobs, yet it also is one of the most noble and respected professions that a person can choose to enter; and

Whereas, the New York State Fallen Firefighters Memorial stands as a symbol of our commitment to always remember and honor those generations of men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice to keep our communities safe and, each October, we solemnly commemorate the firefighters who have died in the line of duty with a special ceremony at this inspiring Memorial; and

Whereas, this occasion also provides an opportunity for New Yorkers to extend gratitude to all of the firefighters currently serving in communities across this state, as we join to pay tribute to the daily heroism of those who proudly wear the firefighter's uniform;
